### LESSON PLAN #1 : LEADERSHIP CANVAS - PAINTING MY LEADERSHIP JOURNEY

#### **Objective:**

Students will engage in a semester-long reflective and creative process to develop their personal leadership identity by completing a "Leadership Canvas." Through this semester-long activity, they will articulate their word of the year, leadership mission, values, vision, qualities, definition, goals, personality, styles, role, influences, and the legacy they want to leave.

#### **Materials Needed:**

- Art supplies (markers, colored pencils, paints, etc.)
- Printed handouts with prompts for each section of the Leadership Canvas

#### Discussion:

- Begin by discussing the concept of personal leadership identity. Explain that individuals have unique leadership qualities, values, and goals that shape their leadership journey.
- Introduce the "Leadership Canvas" activity and explain that it involves creating a visual representation of one's leadership journey using various elements.
